OVERVIEW



WHAT IS NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP (NFP)?

NFP transforms the first thousand days of life for babies born to moms living in poverty. Beginning during pregnancy, and until the child is two, nurses visit moms at home to educate them on parenting, share resources, and perform health checks.

HOME VISITS

Nurses typically visit moms in the comfort of their own homes however we have now pivoted to virtual visits to ensure the safety of moms and nurses.

PROVEN SUCCESS

NFP is a nationally recognized program.
Of the 116 births since July 2019, only 6 babies were born pre-term, and only 5 were born at a low birth weight.

Of the 150 moms enrolled in that time period:

- 80% received prenatal care in their first trimester
 - 91% of moms initiated breastfeeding
 - 40.2% continuing to breastfeed at 6 months.



MEET CHAJUANNA

Nurse Amber met Chajuanna in her 28th week of pregnancy, when Chajuanna was experiencing complications. Amber was able to provide critical support during the challenging time leading up to the premature birth of Chajuanna's daughter. Amber continued regular visits to provide support with newborn care, recovery and breastfeeding.

As an advocate for Chajuanna, Amber also connected her with a WiNGS financial coach, who worked with her to develop a household budget, and build a savings to start the business of her dreams. Through the WiNGS Women's Enterprise Center program, Chajuanna took even further steps toward that dream, and thereafter launched North Star Catering Company.
